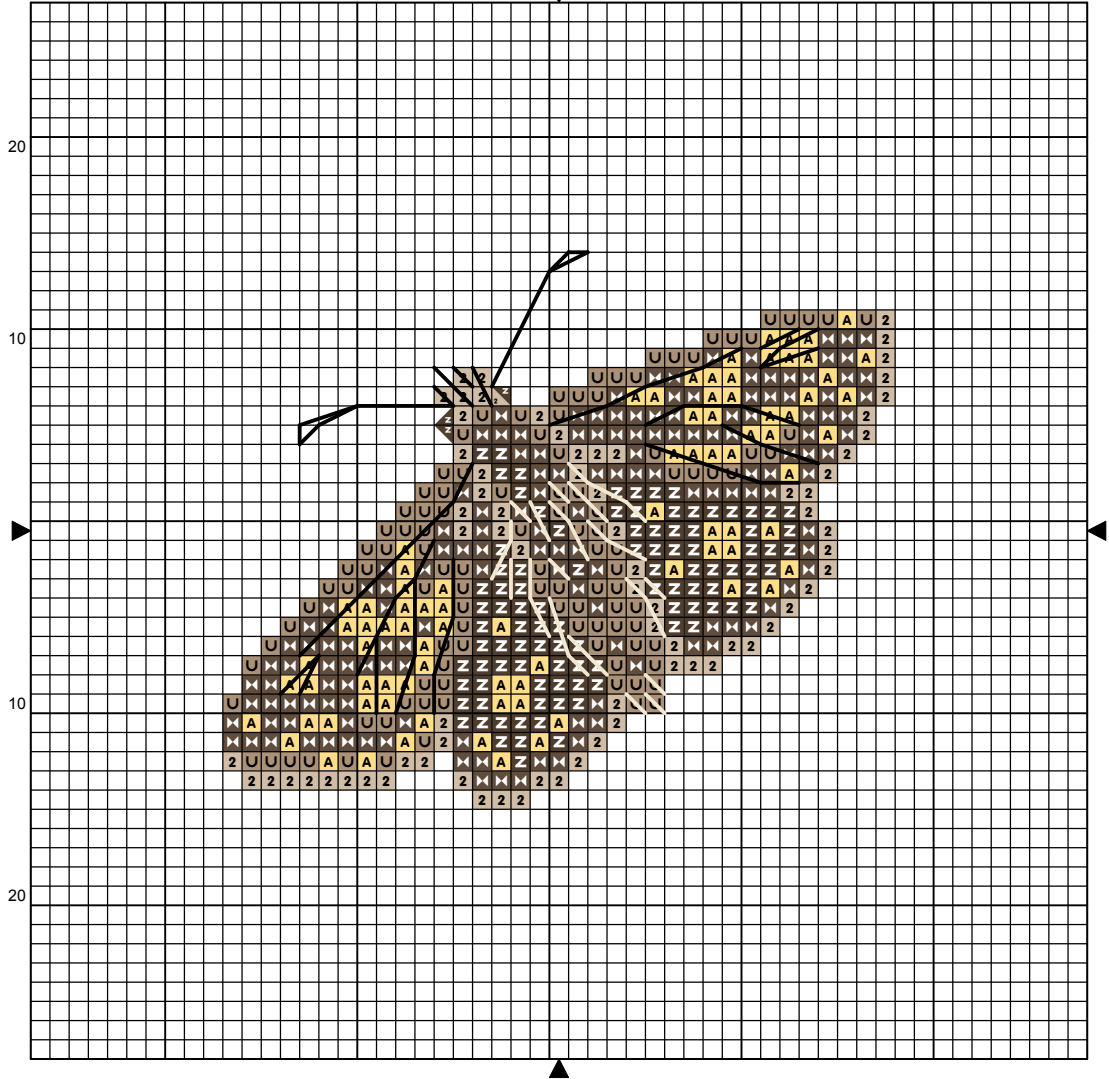

Design size: 2.50 x 2.07 inches or 6.35 x 5.26 cm



Instructions and Symbol Key for Design "BftB Chequered Skipper"

Fabric: 14 count White Aida

Stitches: 35 x 29 **Size:** 2.50 x 2.07 inches or 6.35 x 5.26 cm

Colours: DMC

Use 2 strands of thread for cross stitch

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Back from the Brink

A set of seven endangered British Wildlife designs created in partnership with Back from the Brink, an ambitious conservation project focussed on bringing some of Britain's most threatened species of animals, plants and fungi back from extinction. Stitch these designs to raise awareness or for fundraising, the designs include the Willow Tit, Pine Marten, Grey Long-eared Bat, Pheasant's-eye, Interrupted Brome, Shril Carder Bee and Chequered Skipper.

Chequered Skipper

The Chequered Skipper died out in England in the 1970s due to its favoured habitat, sunny woodland glades and rides, disappearing due to lack of traditional management. In 2018, after years of working with landowners and restoring habitat, the Chequered Skipper was reintroduced to a secret site in Northamptonshire.
